

International Student House Residential Scholarship Application Fall 2019

APPLICATIONS DUE: APRIL 15, 2019

International Student House of Washington, DC (ISH-DC) is a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization under US law. More than 10,000 international scholars representing more than 140 countries, including the United States, have lived at ISH-DC since our founding in 1936. ISH-DC provides an exceptional residential experience to a highly diverse international community of graduate students, interns, and visiting scholars. The House promotes intercultural dialogue, encourages lifelong connections, and fosters global citizenship. Our goal is to lay the foundations for long-term and long-distance global relationships that are realized when scholars return to their countries.

You must complete a **housing application** and **scholarship application**. The housing application is what all residents submit to live at ISH-DC and is online. ISH-DC works with area universities to identify students with academic promise and financial need. Residential scholarships are awarded in the amount of \$2,500 per semester, which covers 1/3 to 1/2 the cost of room and board. Room and board rates range from \$1,304 to \$1,840 per month. Our scholarships are awarded to applicants who demonstrate special financial need and academic promise, and who will contribute to the geographic and ethnic diversity of the ISH-DC resident population. Both international and U.S. students may apply. The process is competitive and not all applicants receive scholarships. Final applications are reviewed and selected by members of the Board of Directors serving on the Scholarship Committee.

Scholarship funding sources include gifts from individual donors and grants from foundations and corporations. Applicants who are awarded a residential scholarship are expected to communicate with donors, and may be asked to thank the donor and/or foundation in writing or in person. In addition, scholarship recipients are asked to prepare a statement of the impact that the scholarship has had on their ability to concentrate on studies and professional career objectives. In some cases participation in programs produced by ISH is required.

Eligibility requirements for residential scholarships may vary, but candidates must meet these criteria:

- Be 21 years or older;
- Possess an unconditional offer of admission from one of our local academic institutions for Master's or Doctoral degree courses, or the equivalent;
- Demonstrate financial need, academic promise, and the ability to contribute to the diversity of the ISH-DC resident population;
- Be a current resident or be in the process of submitting a housing application to ISH-DC.

A complete application includes:

- 1. A completed residential scholarship application, including a personal statement DUE: April 15th 2019
- 2. A personal resume/CV.



- 3. A completed ISH-DC housing application, found online at www.ishdc.org.
- 4. A statement of academic merit and extent of financial need; this is automatically provided to ISH-DC by the applicant's university.

Application Timeline

Application Materials Due	April 15 th 2019	Applicants must deliver applications to their university representatives.
Scholarship Committee Meeting	May 9 th	ISH-DC's Scholarship Committee will review applications.
Award Notification Emails Sent	May 31 st	All applicants will be notified whether they have been awarded a scholarship by May 31st.
Statement of Agreement Due	July 1 st	Upon notification of their awards, recipients will be required to sign a Statement of Agreement acknowledging ISH-DC's requirements for award recipients.
Scholarship Disbursements September - December	September 1 st , October 1 st , November 1 st and December 1 st	Scholarship disbursements will begin on September 1 st . The total fall award will be divided into 4 equal monthly amounts.
Reapplication Materials Available	November 1 st	To be considered for a spring scholarship, recipients must provide (1) documentation that they are still enrolled full time at their universities, and (2) a reflection paper describing their contributions to the community.
Scholarship Disbursements January - May	January 1 st , February 1 st , March 1 st , April 1 st , May 1 st	Scholarship disbursements will continue January 1 st . The total spring award will be divided into 5 equal monthly amounts.
